JOINING OUR CHURCH ELECTORAL ROLL

The church electoral roll is being revised during the month of March. If you are not yet on the church electoral roll, you can sign up to join it from Sunday 7th to Sunday 28th March. Forms are available in both churches. People must be 16 or over and baptised, **and** must either live in the parish (please check boundaries) **or** have worshipped at St James' and Emmanuel for 6 months. Our APCM (Church AGM) is on Sunday 25 April and you need to be on the Electoral Roll in order to vote!

It would be helpful if people who are already on the roll and who have moved in the last year would send in a new form with your new address on it.

Celebrating Many Centuries of Ministry in Didsbury

I prepared a 'draft' version of a new publication entitled 'Celebrating Many Centuries of Ministry in Didsbury' in time for the Licensing, Induction and Commissioning of Nick Bundock on 31st January 2010 as the latest 'Minister' of 'Didsbury'. Since then a few long-term parishioners of St James' and Emmanuel (Stan Morris, Howard Gardener, Margaret Greaves, Sylvia Hillier, Sue Good, Margaret Arkell, John Gunstone, Monica Lee) and Bishop David Hallatt, one of our former Ministers, have been reading the draft for me and giving me a few amendments, for which I am very grateful. I am hoping that this publication will be ready for general release and sale by Easter. It contains a brief history of the church and mini biographies of all the known Ministers of 'Didsbury' from the reign of Queen Elizabeth I in 1563 to the reign of Queen Elizabeth I in 2010, who served at Didsbury Chapel, St James' Church, Emmanuel Church and the joint Parish of St James' and Emmanuel. Hopefully it gives a glimpse in to the life of the church in the community of Didsbury for over four centuries. Although our church's earliest records date back to 1236, prior to the reign of Queen Elizabeth I the names of ministers were rarely known. All proceeds from the sale of this publication will go to church funds.
